Rehearsals are ongoing -- all masked. I hope all of you join us at Second Reformed Church in Hackensack on Dec. 5, 2021 at 3:00 P.M. to view the concert which will be taped, but NOT livestreamed. At that time, you will all see how it played out. Hopefully after that day, my "church vertigo" will be a thing of the past.
