

We are saddened to hear that Barbara Fenn Wysession died peacefully in her home in Teaneck, NJ, on Saturday, Dec 29, 2018, at the age of 85. A very loyal member of our chapter, she was an unyielding force of cheerfulness and optimism who loved music and nature. Barbara was a talented musician who taught music to thousands of students both as a public-school music teacher and through private lessons, and helped countless others as a music therapist in New Jersey hospitals. Barbara played and taught the piano, cello, flute, and recorder, and later



in life learned the viola da gamba, and was a professional church organist for most of her life. Services and donation instructions have yet to be established.
